### Football Awards

Principals and coaches are requested to check with particular care on any proposals to present awards to football players, coaches or schools whose teams might have earned recognition.

It is not permissible for players to accept any awards from sources outside their own schools. The only awards that may be accepted are local school letters or awards by leagues, such as medals, provided the league awards are announced before the season opens.

Certificates of award from agencies outside the schools are not permitted. It is the custom of many civic organizations to honor local athletes by means of recognition dinners and programs, but these must be confined to the athletes of the local community. There is a definite limit upon the value of awards that may be accepted by coaches.
